Attendees are expected to adhere to any additional posted rules and all instructions from staff and volunteers during the event. General

Please be considerate of the attendees around you. Do not sound your horn during the showing. If you need the attention of staff or volunteers, we will be walking the grounds in reflective gear throughout the evening.

Admission

Entry to the drive-in is granted on a per-vehicle basis with pre-sold tickets. Tickets must be purchased online before entry will be allowed.

Arrival & Parking

Arrive early! **Gates open at 6:30PM.** We recommend you plan ahead and arrive early for this event. The best parking spots go to the first in line.

Parking: One space per car, and 'first come, first served!' Spaces may not be reserved or saved, even if you've paid in advance for friends. In order to maximize parking availability, we may ask you to move your vehicle, either closer to a pole or to another area.

You are welcome to turn your vehicle so the back faces the screen. Hatchbacks must not be raised higher than the top of the vehicle. You may want to bring string to help hold hatchback doors in place.

For the viewing comfort of all, larger vehicles will be required to park in designated areas. Staff may designate parking, at our discretion.

ALL of your vehicle lights must be off while you are parked. Other distracting lights on, in, and around your vehicle, including strobes, neons, blinking/flashing novelties, video displays and TV sets must also be turned off.

Seating Arrangements: Patrons may sit on conventional lawn furniture if it is placed between your vehicle and the screen and does not enter into space available for other patrons. For safety, sitting or lying on ground, whether on the grass, on blankets, on air mattresses or other inflatables is not allowed. Patrons may not lay on the ground between vehicles.

Patrons may not sit on top of vehicles. However, you are welcome to sit in the back of hatchbacks and in truck beds.

Movie Sound

A car or portable FM radio is required to hear the digital sound system. We do not have outdoor speakers. Some smart phone radios MAY pick up our sound system, but we cannot guarantee synchronization of picture and sound when using these devices.

Food

You are more than welcome to bring your own food to this event. However, we will have delicious food options from Tre's House of Cheesesteaks and Thyme Well Spent.

Restroom Availability

Restrooms are available in the Museum of Flight lobby. You must wear a mask any time you exit your vehicle.

Speed Limit

Within the event grounds, the speed limit is 10 MPH. There will be pedestrians, so please observe this limit and drive carefully. For everyone's safety, any negligent driving may result in your being asked to leave the premises.

Pets

Pets must be under your direct control and responsibility at all times. They must be on leash when not secured in your vehicle, and we ask that you clean up after them. Animals are not allowed in the museum or restrooms with the exception of legitimate service dogs.

Drugs & Alcohol

We are not permitted to allow alcohol on event grounds. Under Washington law, marijuana consumption in public is prohibited.

Dead Batteries

You know your vehicle best. If you believe your battery may die at some point during the event, please turn your vehicle on for several minutes (keeping lights off) to keep your battery charged.
